#### State Revenue News Idaho Egg Notes by M.E. Matesen

The following are some corrections for the catalog I have noted

In the Type I eggs, the heading reading "Extra A" should be changed to "Extra Grade A" because that is how it reads on the stamps (as the illustration shows)

Under Type I Trade C, the only Trade C stamp I know to exist is the E20 15 dozen yellow. E19 I think is a Checks\*.

Under Type II in the classification of Extra A, a one dozen Medium pink exists. In the Type IV issues E79 and E82 appear to be the same. E82 I believe should

read 15 dozen instead of 1 dozen. In the SRN October 1962 page 22 issue it indicates that the colors given by the state for the stamps are:

Grade AA - blue Grade A- red

Grade B - green

Grade C - orange


Graded Eggs - black

and that the stamps came in boxes of 500 and sold for \$1.50 a box.

Here is a case where the state's descriptions are less than accurate. The intended red is pink, And the intended orange stamps are yellow. The Graded Eggs stamps are apparently the circular die cuts.

\* Since this article was written by Mack, a 1 dozen Check of the Type I eggs was reported on buff paper. This article original indicated these were black on white paper. It is possible the buff paper is a discoloration.

A Type III Grade A Medium stamp (E50) reads "EXTRA GRADE A". I do not know if all the Grade A's have the word EXTRA do.

This week I acquired three recent (2011) egg cartons from Pennsylvania. All three have a PEOAP imprint of some kind. However one of them also has a red keystone imprint with "PENNSYLVANIA/ CERTIFIED/GRADED/UNDER STATE/ SUPERVISION". These are from Esbenshade Farms. This is similar to the older keystone symbol but does not include the Permit Number like cartons I obtained in the 1970's.



The egg certification program is

*Note - This appears to be a new symbol* for the Pennsylvania Egg Certification inspections which are described in detail in the article "A Pennsylvania Egg Stamp" by Scott Troutman in the 2nd Quarter 2006 SRN p.7. This program dates from 1965. aimed at improved grading and candling, whereas PEQAP is aimed at samonella elimination in the egg stream.

## Page 13 / 4th Qtr 2011 **Little Mystery** 1939 Nebraska Fish & Hunt Stamp by Scott Troutman



Shown is a 1939 Kansas permit to fish and hunt with a pretty average signed Scott RW6 duck stamp. A nice usage of a duck stamp. But above and under the duck stamp is what appears to be a Nebraska stamp issued as part of the license to hunt and fish. It is partially covered but is signed and has a red serial number. The stamp is black on white. "1939" is in a half tone black. The instructions on the license are as follows:

"State laws require this permit to be worn in a badge in plain sight on breast or hat of holder at all times when hunting or fishing. Fold to quarter size so that the number will be exposed through the window of badge."

This seems to imply that this "stamp" is what makes the license valid, as the red serial number is the only number on the license. Does any one else have a license from this year with one of these stamps on it? Do they exist for other years?
